### *Historical Overview*

1965 – Present

In the year of 1907 in Richmond Virginia at a session of the Imperial Council of The ancient Egyptian Arabic Order of the Noble of the Mystic Shrine, the roots and principles of the Daughters of Isis were planted to grow into an Auxiliary of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. A ritual with rules and regulations were prepared and approved. Thus the Daughters of Isis started a journey down the lanes of times.

The vast wheel of time has turned onward and Nabbar Court No. 123, has reached its fifty-year milestone. Our journey began and proceeds as follows:

On July 10, 1965 at 4:00PM, at 330 Auburn Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia, nineteen diligent ladies gathered together with the late Imperial Commandress, Daughter Anita G. Adams of Tuskegee, Alabama and others from her divan to reactivate Nabbar Court No. 123. Thus, Nabbar was on its way again.

These are Daughters of great distinction who worked hard to achieve and build Nabbar Court No. 123.
