


Newsletter Committee






Marren Dickens became a member of the Nabbar Court Youth Group at 9 years old and remained a member until she graduated from high school at 18. She was actively engaged in the meetings and community service projects with this youth group as well as the Golden Circle Doves and the King Solomon Youth Chapter. Extending charity and giving to the homeless as a child was the catalyst for her continued benevolence in her adulthood. Marren learned to play the saxophone and keyboards while in grade school and would share her musical talent during various programs. Her love of reading resulted in her winning a book reading contest and her appreciation for language arts motivated her to go beyond the written word and excel in oratorical competitions.

Marren earned her Bachelor's Degree in Political Science with a concentration in Pre-Law from the University of Alabama. Marren earned a Master's Degree in Business Administration

with a concentration in Healthcare Administration and Human Resources from Keiser University in March 2020; however, due to the COVID-19 pandemic, commencement ceremonies were not held until February 2021. She aspires to be a criminal attorney and is exploring schools and preparing to take the LSAT. Marren is currently working at The Georgia Department of Public Health as a Human Resources Recruiter.

Marren recalled her grandfather telling her about the civil rights movement when she would visit him during her childhood in Tuscaloosa, Alabama. His stories of crossing of the Edmund Pettus Bridge in Selma, Alabama on March 5, 1967 known as "Bloody Sunday" and working with Dr. Martin Luther, King, Jr. inspired her to want to give back to the community. One of the issues she wants to impact is the inequity in sentencing of African Americans for petty crimes. Her grandfather has had a 20-year political career and was one of the first black mail carriers in Tuscaloosa. Fifty years after the height of the civil rights movement, Marren would endure her own plight with racism when President Barack Obama was elected. She remembered that the halls of the high school were quiet in response to the day many thought America would never see, a black man elected as President of the United States. A white classmate confronted her and she refused to oblige the argument; however, still received discipline. She also had to navigate the paradox of white classmates whose parents had a disdain for African Americans.

Where are they now?

When asked if she is following the recent trials regarding racial injustice, she expressed that she is concerned about the lives of her husband and son as black males. In light of what happened to Ahmad Aubrey who was killed in Brunswick, Georgia and George Floyd who died while being physically restrained by the police in Minneapolis, Minnesota, she is constantly thinking about how to raise her children in this country, whether or not her husband will return home when he leaves the house, and how she would be treated if approached by the police.

In addition to her goal of becoming a Criminal Attorney, Marren has political aspirations that she hopes to pursue. She proudly stated that she would love to run for her grandfather's former seat of District 2 in Tuscaloosa, Alabama if she ever chose to reside there again. Ultimately, Marren would like to move to Washington, D.C. to further her career. She understands that accomplishing her goals will take diligence and patience. She noted that people want to see change immediately but they do not want to take the time to learn the processes to fulfill the change. Knowing that firsthand knowledge and experience is beneficial, Marren has also worked on mayoral and gubernatorial campaigns.

Michelle Obama's quote, "When they go low, we go high." is one of her favorite quotes and *Brighter Day* by Kirk Franklin is one of her favorite songs.

Marren is the daughter of Past Commandress Denise Mundy. This extraordinary young lady is the wife of Mr. Taylor Dickens, mother of two beautiful children, Merci and Matthew, owner of The Merci Rose Brand, LLC., and a member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.



When it comes to the safety of being vaccinated against COVID-19, it is important to have the facts. We are sharing information on the process of vaccine development, so you can feel confident in the safety and effectiveness of COVID-19 vaccines.

Safety first — speed second

COVID-19 vaccines were developed faster than past vaccines due to real-time research sharing among scientists, advance funding made available to vaccine developers, and the use of existing technology. While speed of development was important, safety was not sacrificed. The vaccines were tested on tens of thousands of people and met the safety and effectiveness standards required for Emergency Use Authorization (EUA) by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) before being distributed in the U.S.

Clinical trials

Before issuing emergency approval for the COVID-19 vaccines, the FDA had to determine that the known and potential benefits of each vaccine outweighed the known and potential risks. They reviewed clinical, nonclinical, and manufacturing data from extensive research, lab tests, and clinical trials. Clinical trials were required to study the safety and side effects of the vaccines. In the third and final phase, tens of thousands of people volunteered, and the health of vaccinated and unvaccinated individuals was compared to determine vaccine effectiveness.

V-safe

The CDC is also using V-safe to study vaccine side effects in real-time. V-safe is a post-vaccination health checker that allows vaccinated individuals to quickly report any side effects to the CDC right from their smartphone. As the vaccines are distributed, V-safe will help the CDC keep more accurate records of vaccine side effects across the population.




