Auditing Committee

The Audit Committee is appointed annually by the current Illustrious Commandress. The committee is responsible to audit all books and records of the Recordress, Treasurer, and the final report of **all** court fundraisers.

To determine whether the information contained in the Recordress and Treasurer's records are an accurate reflection of the finances of the Court for the audit period complies with both the bylaws of the Court and the Constitution and General Laws of the Imperial Court, an Auxiliary of the AEAONMS Inc.

IMPERIAL COURT REPORTING:

- The Constituent Courts will submit an annual audit for the time period of November 1st to October 31st. Books for this period are to be turned over to the Audit Committee at the end of the November meeting. The report is to be read in the December meeting before elections. A copy of the report is due to Imperial Headquarters by January 20th.

CONSTITUENT COURT REPORTING:

- 1st Period: November 1st – April 30th – Books for this period are to be turned over to the Audit Committee at the end of the May meeting. A copy is due to Imperial Headquarters by July 15th.
- 2nd Period: May 1st – October 31st – Books for this period are to be turned over to the Audit Committee at the end of the November meeting. A copy is due to Imperial Headquarters by Jan 20th. (Admin Manual 2005 pg 41)

The Auditing Process

The audit committee should:

- Meet with the Recordress and Treasurer to explain the audit plans and process to be used during the audit.
- Give the Recordress and Treasurer an opportunity to explain any known discrepancies, concerns, changes or new procedures.
- Receive all books from the Recordress, Treasurer and applicable committees.
- Compile all data and compare for discrepancies.
- Review results with the Commandress, Treasurer, Recordress and all affected committee chairs.
- Allow Commandress, Treasurer, Recordress and affected committee chairs the opportunity to respond prior to making final report to the Court.
- Return all books.
- Present written report to court (copies should be made available to all court members) in June and December (before elections).

Note: The audit report should not be a surprise to the fiscal officers, as the findings were discussed during the audit process

Submission of audit to the Imperial Court

It is the responsibility of both the Audit Chair and the Recordress that the report is mailed timely to Imperial Headquarters (Attn: Imperial Daughters Internal Auditors 2239 Democrat Rd Memphis, TN 38132).

The Audit Committee Chair should:

- Provide at least three copies to the Recordress for:
 - Recordress' record
 - Court's historical record
 - Submission to Imperial Court Headquarters

Courts are not required to request dispensations for Thanksgiving Service, Feast, Jubilee Day Service sponsored by the Temple or Desert Conference and /or Gala Day celebrations. The Imperial Deputy for the Oasis does not issue dispensations but ensures that they are secured by the Recordress.

Dispensation(s) Procedures

APPROVED

DISAPPROVED

All Courts are required to request dispensations from the Imperial Commandress to hold special meetings, special elections, ceremonies, special activities, emergency meetings, all fundraisers, and to appear in public in regalia. Dispensations must be secured for change of meeting date, time, location, creation and parades. All dispensations are secured by the Recordress with the recent exception of dispensations for community service activities. Dispensations for community service actives only are now approved by the Imperial Deputy for the Desert. The Imperial Deputies for the Oases are to submit community service dispensations to the Imperial Deputy for the Desert who will approve and submit a courtesy copy to the Office of the Imperial Potentate. The Imperial Deputy for the Oasis is to be given a courtesy copy of all dispensations.

Timeframe: 60 days before the event

Schedule of Fees:

- \$10 No-Revenue/Non-Fundraisers producing events
- \$20 Revenue/Fundraisers producing events
- \$100 Penalty for late submission

Dispensations are **not** required for: Thanksgiving Service & Feast, Jubilee Day Service sponsored by the temple or Gala Day celebrations.

Right to Visit Other Constituent Courts



Section 1: Excluding an Imperial Council Divan Member and Imperial Court Divan Member, the right of every Daughter in good standing to visit a Court, is subordinate to the right of the Court to receive the visit; and the Illustrious Commandress shall not admit a non-member in opposition to a vote of her Court or to the objection of a member.

Section 2: No visitor shall be admitted to the Court until her qualifications have been ascertained by examination of her current dues card: the result of such examination shall be reported in open meeting before the visitor is introduced


Temple Visitation

History of the Imperial Court






The Imperial Court, is an auxiliary of female family members of Prince Hall Shriners, and was formally organized at the annual session of the Ancient Egyptian Arabic Order Nobles of the Mystic Shrine, held in Detroit, Michigan, on August 24, 1910.

The establishment of the Imperial Court was a result of a meeting held in 1909, when women representing the auxiliary of female members of Prince Hall Shriners from Maryland, Rhode Island and Washington, DC, met with a committee of Prince Hall Shriners and requested the formation and recognition of an organization for their women relatives.

The Imperial Court, a charitable and benevolent organization, stresses the development of powerful leaders, encourages health awareness among youth and adults, provides services to help disabled and senior citizens, provides for effective networking among its members and other organizations, recognizes and celebrates the historic and current achievement of African American women, exerts positive influence and utilizes the tool of role modeling for youth, teenage mothers, high school and college students, and disseminates information for educational opportunities and career planning to youth and young adults.



Specific program thrusts include education and scholarship, health, mentoring our youth and senior citizens, book bags and school supplies for adopted schools, and the Youth. In addition to volunteer activities, financial donations are made annually to College Fund/UNCF, scholarships, Health and Medical Research, American Cancer Society, Mental Retardation, NAACP, National Foundation (Birth Defects), HIV/AIDS Awareness and other civic and special interests.

This organization of 12 courts at its inception has grown to almost 209 courts located in the United States, Canada, the Bahamas, Germany, Italy and Japan.

Story of the Egyptian Goddess



Isis & Osiris: The Greatest Love of All Time

Osiris, Isis, Typhon and Nephthys are the children of Geb and Nut. Osiris is the eldest son and Typhon, his younger brother. Osiris took Isis as his wife, and Typhon took Nephthys. Isis and Osiris, are the ones who civilize humanity, making them popular and prosperous. Osiris seats on the throne of Egypt while Typhon, jealous of his brother's fertility, tries to take power and install his reign and dominion over the country. To do so, he plotted to put an end to Osiris prosperous reign. Typhon, with the help of his companions, captures Osiris, binds him, and throws his body into the waters of the Nile.

Isis, the widow in tears, painfully searches for her husband's body. She finds Osiris under a sycamore and takes refuge with him in the marshes of the Nile's delta. Typhon eventually finds the hidden body, and furious, decides to destroy what remains of Osiris forever, by cutting and shredding his body into fourteen pieces that he disperses across the country.

Helped by Nephthys, and others, Isis searches for all the parts of Osiris' scattered body and after a long quest, finds all of them, except his penis. With help, Isis then reconstitutes the body of her husband, and embalms him. The body being inert, it is thanks to Nephthys' divine knowledge that they are able to perform a ritual that allows Osiris to resurrect from the dead and come back to life.

This story reveals something obvious, which is the importance of Isis:

- When Osiris dies, it is Isis who searches for his body and finds it.
- When Typhon's cuts Osiris' body in 14 parts, it is still Isis who finds the pieces, reconstituting and mummifying the body so that her husband does not perish.
- Assisted by her sister Nephthys, Isis allows Osiris to resurrect from the dead, and thus gain eternal life. Osiris is therefore not a savior but a "saved".
- It is also Isis who decides to give Osiris' an offspring or a reincarnation, Horus. Isis protects and educates Horus, in order for him to take the throne when he grows up.
- Most importantly, it is Isis who opens the door of eternal life to Osiris.
