HISTORY

In the year of 1907 in Richmond Virginia at a session of the Imperial Council of the Ancient Egyptian Arabic Order of the Noble of the Mystic Shrine, the roots and principles of the Daughters of Isis were planted to grow into an Auxiliary of the Nobles of the Mystic Shrine. A ritual with rules and regulations were prepared and approved. Thus, the Daughters of Isis started a journey down the lanes of times.

The vast wheel of time has turned on ward and Nabbar Court No. 123 is approaching its milestone of fifty-five years. Our journey began and proceeds as follows:

On July 10, 1965 at 4:00 PM, at 330 Auburn Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia, nineteen diligent ladies gathered together with the late Imperial Commandress, Daughter Anita G. Adams of Tuskegee, Alabama and others from her divan to reactivate Nabbar Court No. 123. Thus, Nabbar was on its way again.

These are Daughters of great distinction who worked hard to achieve and build Nabbar Court No. 123.

Under the leadership of Illustrious Commandress Dorothy Jackson the membership in Nabbar Court increased with the creation of 20 Daughters. We also became more proficient in the ritualistic work of the Order. The Court’s Constitution and By-Laws were completely revised. We celebrated our 25th Anniversary honoring our Chartered members and Past Commandresses; we also had our first Hawaiian Luau. Daughter Mary McLurkin was appointed Deputy Imperial Directress for Special Charities and Benevolence by the Imperial Commandress, Daughter Jewel R. Lane. During our 1991 Desert Gala Day, Illustrious Commandress Jackson was voted as Interim Treasurer for the Desert of Georgia following the resignation of Daughter Florence M. Hogan who had served faithfully for over twenty-five years.

During Gala Day 1991, Nabbar Court 123 and its members received the following awards, certificates and trophies; Membership Award and Trophy; Best Scrapbook Award and Trophy; Best Scrapbook Cover and Trophy; Court having the largest number of Daughters in Attendance; Certificate of Meritorious Service; Commandress of the Year – Presented to Illustrious Commandress Dorothy J. Jackson; Daughter of the Year – Presented to Daughter Gwendolyn Bonaparte; Third Place Queen’s Contest Presented to Daughter Marian Pierce; Certificate for Egyptian Tea Participation – Daughter Ruby Pollard; Certificate for Scrapbook Committee – Daughter Mollie Scott; Certificate for Health & First Aid Committee - Daughter Mary McLurkin; Certificate for Workshop – Daughter Dorothy Jackson.

We held our first Health Fair as a service to the community; it was chaired by Daughter Ruby Pollard. In October the Court went on a fun trip to the Birmingham Dog Tracks in Alabama, this event was chaired by Daughter Lillian Grier.

We had a very successful Turkey Give-Away in November. We gave away twenty (20) turkeys.

We made contributions to the following: Sickle Cell Foundation, American Cancer Society, NAACP, UNCF, Mental Retardation, Wood/Jackson Family (Burned Our), Queen of Queens (Imperial Court), Council of Battered Women.

Thanks to Allah we had no deceased Daughters.

A much deserved Christmas party was celebrated jointly by the Nobles and Daughters of Nabbar Temple and Court. It was a Gala affair, one to be remembered. During the December 1993 meeting the Illustrious Commandress presented awards to Daughters for doing an outstanding job in their positions. Daughter Lillian Grier was elected as the 1994 Illustrious Commandress and was presented a corsage by Daughter Scott; she also presented Daughter Jettie Lights, Deputy of the Desert with a gift.

In 2022, Nabbar Court's objective was PEACE (Purposefully Enhancing our Affiliation through Charity and Education).
